Under the headline, "BATTLE OF CITY HALL: 400 Cops Fight Student Crowd," white-helmeted motorcycle policemen are shown dragging passive students down the wet marble stairs. We have reproduced this front page into a 17" by 22" poster, suitable for framing, which is not only a memento of the San Francisco demonstrations, but a symbol of the rebirth of student interest in American democracy. All proceeds from the sale of these posters will go toward the legal defense of Robert Meisenbach, a University of California undergraduate in English, who was arrested on May 13 and whose case is still before the courts. He is charged with a felony--beating an officer with his own billy club--and was accused, in this same edition of the CHRONICLE, of being the "ringleader" of those arrested and of precipitating the hosing in the San Francisco demonstrations. The charge against him has changed, in the face of such evidence as the photograph in the May 23, 1960 edition of LIFE magazine, which shows him leaning against a pillar in the back-ground at the beginning of the hosing, but those who participated in the demonstrations believe in his complete innocence, are pledged to his defense. The sale of these posters is one part of this campaign. Orders should include a \$1.00 contribution plus 25¢ for postage and handling, and checks should be made out to the Students Emergency Defense Fund as distinct from checks made out to the Bay Area Student Committee for orders of the literature listed above. Further contributions to the Students Emergency Defense Fund for the legal defense of Robert Meisenbach are most welcome at this time. Meisenbach's trial has been rescheduled again for April 12, 1961, and its cost is estimated to be between \$10,000 and \$15,000. Some \$6,000 has now been raised by student and community fund-raising activities.

The Bay Area Student Committee would like to bring to your attention several additional items on the San Francisco demonstrations which may be of interest to you. The Slate Record Committee has produced an excellent twelve-inch long-play record, "Sounds of Protest," which is of professional quality and was written, produced and narrated by students who participated in the San Francisco demonstrations. The record was cut from tapes made inside and outside the hearing room by a local radio station and is supplemented with student commentary. The record presents a comprehensive picture of these historic demonstrations and is accompanied by a sixteen-page pamphlet on the demonstrations by H. K. Walter, a Bay Area attorney, who was present during two days of the San Francisco demonstrations. All profits from the sales of "Sounds of Protest" will go to the legal defense of Robert Meisenbach. These records are available for \$2.00 each; three for \$5.00 and should be ordered directly from the Slate Record Committee, Post Office Box 893, Berkeley 1, California. Radio Station KPFA-FM now has available transcripts of its two hour-and-a-half documentaries compiled from its extensive coverage of the San Francisco hearings and demonstrations. KPFA has rebroadcast these documentaries several times since May with excellent Bay Area reception and the availability of the written transcripts is most fortunate. The first documentary (part one) includes testimony from the HCUA, "friendly" and "dissenting" witnesses. The second (part two) presents an excellent picture of the student demonstrations including the conversation between the students and the Sheriff of San Francisco and a number of other items which are most helpful in refuting the Hoover Report, "Communist Target--Youth" and the mendacious film, "Operation Abolition." The KPFA coverage of the San Francisco hearings and demonstrations won a prize medal for the station at the Sacramento State Fair. Both part one--on the hearings--and part two--on the demonstrations--should be ordered directly from KPFA, 2207 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley 4, California. They are available for \$1.00 each and California residents should include 4% sales tax.
